Denmark has a long-standing reputation for fine craftsmanship, in particular the exceptional pieces of its mid-20th-century furniture masters. The Chair, by Hans J. Wegner, became world-famous when used by John F. Kennedy on television during his campaign for

the presidency. Arme Jacobsen's Egg Chair and Swan Chair, originally created for the lobby of the SAS Hotel in Copenhagen, are now virtually synonymous with the ideas of Danish design specifically and modern Scandinavian furniture design in general.

most of these classic pieces are still in
production today, often appearing amid ultramodern architecture in
trendy advertisements. Works
by designers such as Kaare Klint,
Finn Juhl, and Verner Panton are
auctioned off as prestigious,
highly prized objects or sold as

But now a new generation of Danish designers has stepped up to take their place, proudly carrying on the heritage of the storied designers of yesteryear. This generation is producing the Danish furniture of today that will become the Danish furniture classics of tomor-

awards for their innovative work. Salto's Runner Chair is just one example of a present-day piece that has found its way into the world. Prominent users of the Runner chair include former U.S. President Bill Clinton. There is also a Runner housed at the Art Association in Denmark, and when the Danish Design Center opened its new building in the center of Copenhagen last year, Salto's latest chair, the Blade, was a natural choice.

These young Danish furniture designers - both those who are already prize-winners, as well as those whose prizes are yet to

come - are assembled in the "Danes on the Move" exhibition and are ready to give us a glimpse of the seating design of tomorrow.
